An eligibility list may be created for similar positions and will remain in effect for 6 months to fill vacancies within the following Provincial Parks: Grand Beach, Turtle Mountain, Hecla/Grindstone, Paint Lake, St. Norbert, St. Malo, and Whiteshell. Bunkhouse accommodations may be provided at some locations. Some positions require bilingual (French and English).

Essential qualifications include:

- Minimum two years enrolment in a University Degree or Diploma in the Biological or Natural Sciences, History, Geography, Education, Tourism, or Natural Resource Management and experience in the field of interpretation, including developing, delivering, promoting and administration of interpretive programs using a variety of techniques, or an equivalent combination of education, training and experience.
- Strong interpersonal skills with the ability to interact effectively with visitors of all ages.
- Strong verbal communication skills including experience conducting public presentations.
- Strong computer skills with experience using Microsoft Office or other comparable software applications.
- Effective written communication skills.
- Ability to work independently and under minimal supervision.
- Effective organizational skills with the ability to meet strict deadlines.

Desired qualifications include:

- Supervisory experience.
- Knowledge of the unique and important natural, cultural, historical and management aspects in Manitoba Provincial Parks.
- Knowledge of policies including rules and regulations related to Manitoba Provincial Parks that affect park visitors.

### Conditions of Employment include the following:

- Must possess and maintain a valid full stage Manitoba Class 5 driver's license.
- Must be willing and physically able to perform the duties of the position including working in various types of outdoor conditions.
- Must be willing and able to work evenings and weekends.
- Must be willing and able to travel with occasional overnight accommodations.
